FOREWORD



The past year has been the most challenging year for cancer patients and carers and the organisation itself. After the positive start of the initial few months in 2020, Covid just took over and put a standstill to all activities with imposed lockdowns, impacting cancer patients, carers and the entire not for profit sector. For cancer patients, it was an emotional and a practical nightmare to afford and access timely treatment, sustaining in cities, away from home and loved ones in these challenging times with no income or even capacity to generate it.

During lockdown, for CPAA, screening, prevention, early detection, and advocacy related activities decreased and eventually totally stopped. As an organisation we totally focussed on patient care and support activities ensuring access to treatment for all patients registered with us. We were confronted with decrease in donations and incapacity to raise funds through regular events and fund-raising activities.

The Executive committee worked closely to define and implement measures to protect and deliver mission of Total Management of Cancer for patients in hardship and strengthen the organisation's resilience. We formed committees and contacted all our registered patients and care givers and focused on implementing remotely operated measures to ensure timely treatment and care.

We are extremely proud to share our activity report with you that clearly demonstrates efforts and outcome. We also focussed on the wellbeing, health and safety of our employees and simultaneously applied comprehensive cost cutting initiatives at all levels, launching a series of initiatives and processes including learning development, upskilling and modernization through technology to strengthen the organisation.

This has resulted in adapting to a new NORMAL through difficult and tough decisions. While the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic brought many challenges, it also taught us some especially important lessons, such as the need to stay connected, to protect your people and communities as best you can. We worked remotely on a continuous basis to build trust and define new ways of building relations.

Overall, I am proud that during pandemic collectively we could remotely:

- Connect with 7,000 cancer patients and carers
- Provide timely support to 2,500 cancer patients to access treatment thereby aiming to impact survival rates and general well being
- Provide rations and nutritional food grains to 1,500 cancer patients every-month
- Provided laptops to student cancer patients studying from home
- Support cancer patients and carers with emotional, financial, and psycho-social support during pandemic

I want to thank all my colleagues for their challenging work and perseverance. On behalf of everyone at CPAA I would also like to thank all the health care professionals and front-line workers who have been helping us in countless ways, as well as our esteemed donors and supporters who stood by us through this tough period and without whom we would not have been able sustain. Today as things are getting better and restrictions are easing slowly, we are even more committed to serving better and reinventing future in new ways while continuing to make a difference for our communities.

2020 was the year we came face-to-face with an unknown pandemic giving rise to unprecedented times. Like many others, CPAA's activities too were hit by the lockdown and access to those needing our help, became severely restricted. Even in times like these, CPAA was able to provide free and subsidised valuable services to those in need due to the generosity of sponsors, donors and the assistance of the local community. With the pandemic taking centre stage much of the support and resources were diverted to Covid Care. Team CPAA, unflinchingly rose to the challenge of trying to beat these insurmountable odds to support patients by ensuring continuous support during the catastrophic COVID-19 outbreak. Battling the two big Cs, Cancer and Covid-19, meant challenging the status quo and out-of-the-box thinking to achieve the goals.



PATIENT CARE: The primary concern of CPAA has always been to meet the needs of poor cancer patients who do not have access nor can afford cancer treatment. The Covid-19 pandemic brought devastating interruptions in ongoing cancer treatment for scores of cancer patients. It especially posed a high risk for those with compromised immunity, causing upstaging of disease. Patients struggled to reach treatment centres, procure drugs, and meet unbudgeted expenses related to food and shelter. Thanks to uninterrupted support and faith from our donors, CPAA was able to ensure continuous funding and provide desperately needed financial and medical aid to these patients through our nation-wide network with hospitals and treatment centres. Mental health becomes even more important during times like these, and our virtual entertainment and out-reach programs tried to give the patients and their caregivers that much needed respite from the stress of hospitals, medicines and needles.

ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS



REHABILITATION: The objective of CPAA's Rehabilitation Centre is to provide economic independence, social camaraderie and hope to cancer patients and their care givers by giving them gainful and appropriate employment. Moreover, patients and caregivers are trained in crafts like tailoring, printing, candle-making, book binding, box-making, envelope-making, painting, and breast prosthesis making, which help them find jobs post treatment. Throughout the lockdown, the centre continued to support patients and caregivers with employment, wages, and food grains. CPAA also participated virtually in various Exhibitions and Sales like Design One. The Breast Prosthesis workshop continued its production of its low-cost, high-quality breast prosthesis, based largely on Indian material and to suit Indian weather conditions. It is ideal for long hours of wear and can be easily machine or hand washed, making it a safe, affordable and hassle-free product, which can be used within weeks of surgery by mastectomy patients. The production workshops too worked year-round to service prestigious orders for the Taj Hotels, and Diyas and Gifts for Corporate Clients which in-turn helped the centre to sustain financially and ensure continuous support.

ADVOCACY: Affordable drugs to treat COVID-19: Since the out-break of the COVID-19 pandemic, CPAA's efforts to provide support to cancer patients have been impacted considerably. It is a fact that patients who are living with cancer and are undergoing chemotherapy and/ or radical radiotherapy for lung cancer, and patients with blood and bone marrow cancer are particularly vulnerable to serious illness if they get COVID-19. With a gap in active cancer treatment some cancers could obstruct, and some could metastasize. The pandemic poses a high risk for these patients with compromised immunity to deteriorate or succumb to COVID-19. In February 2020, Remdesivir, one of the most promising medicines for treating COVID 19 was granted a patent which would have compromised efforts to introduce affordable generic versions of Remdesivir in case of positive clinical trial outcomes. WHO (World Health Organisation) has included this medicine in its multi-locational trial known as SOLIDARITY Trial. Concerned about the COVID-19 risk on cancer patients, CPAA approached the Central Government of India, demanding the revocation of the patent under Section 66 or 64 of the Patents Act. The patent titled COMPOUNDS FOR TREATING FILOVIRIDAE INFECTIONS is granted against the provisions of the Patents Act. It is imperative at a time like this that no monopoly rights be granted, so that more manufacturers can produce the drug and make it available to all the people who need it, at affordable costs.



AWARENESS: CPAA has always been in the forefront of creating awareness by educating people on signs and symptoms of cancer, risk and causative factors, ill effects of tobacco and other related issues. While face-to-face interaction was restricted, participation in cancer awareness webinars continued to fill the gaps in the lack of information which continues to be a major problem in cancer control in India. CPAA was able to address a large number of people, virtually on various forums, to raise awareness about faulty lifestyles and societal practices, which are responsible for high rate of cancer incidence.



EARLY DETECTION: CPAA's Early Detection programme is a patient-friendly, non-invasive screening process, that is effective enough to detect cancer early, yet non-intimidating and friendly for all to be willing to come in and be tested. This program was hugely hampered during the lockdown due to limited mobility of non-emergency medical or investigative services. CPAA's diagnostic team reached out to high-risk groups through tie-ups with local support / community groups to promote and encourage people to investigate early signs and symptoms of cancer, followed up by access to medical care as required. CPAA's state-of-the-art Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) based Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) DNA laboratory at Mahalaxmi, Mumbai continued to offer screening facilities as and when the lockdown was eased.

MAY 2020: The Marathi Film Industry came together virtually to support CPAA's efforts to help cancer patients during the Covid-19 outbreak. Actors Renuka Shahane, Bhagyashree, Sonali Kulkarni, Alka Kubal, Kishori Shahane Vij, Varsha Usgaonkar, Mrunal Kulkarni, Ashok Shinde, Priya Berde, Arun Nalawade, Sameer Dixit and Aishwarya and Avinash Narkar online appeal gathered momentum and encouraged many donors to lend a helping hand.

JUNE 2020: On World No Tobacco Day 2020, a musical concert 'YES TO LIFE' was held on the Digital Platform on 7th June 2020 with the support of World Health Organisation & Ministry of Family Welfare, to create awareness about the ill effects of tobacco.

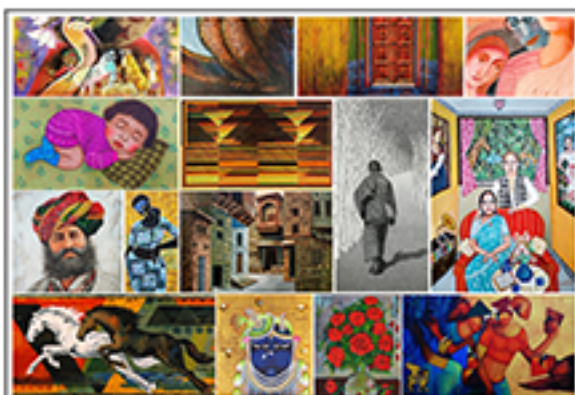
Singer Sandeep Batraa gave a heartfelt performance to 475 patients including cancer patients with Covid-19, virtually, at NSCI dome.

Ganesh Chaturthi was celebrated at the Paediatric ward of B J Wadia Hospital, Mumbai with an eco-friendly Chocolate Ganapati which was immersed in milk to make a delicious Chocolate milk shake for the children.



The 16th edition of Colours of Life 2020 was launched digitally on 22 September 2020, with a virtual Meet 'n' Greet with the participating artists. 136 artists from all over India pledged proceeds from 294 of their beautiful creations to support CPAA's continued commitment to support patients battling Cancer while trying to overcome the obstacles of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Dr. Veena Shukla conducted a seven-day international workshop online for counselors and psychology faculties on 'Crisis counseling, Covid-19, cancer and other natural calamities.

DECEMBER 2020: Khazana, CPAA's annual festival of Ghazals was streamed online to viewers across the world on 19th and 20th December 2020. The program featured rich and vibrant performances by Ghazal Maestro Pankaj Udhas, Anup Jalota, Talat Aziz, Sudeep Banerjee, Mahalaxmi Iyer, Ajay and Abhijeet Pohankar, Pooja Gaitonde, young talent Sneha Shankar, Pratibha Singh Baghel and Deepak Pandit along with a special act by the band Samarpan band featuring Singer Prithvi Gandharv and Gayatri Asokan.

FEBRUARY 2021: World Cancer Day: On World Cancer Day, CPAA joined hands with Rotary Club and Inner Wheel Club of Mumbai Nariman Point, Rotary Dist 3141 and Lotus Leaf Entertainment to present a virtual fundraising concert, Umeed – Ray of Hope. 100 goody bags full of eatables, toys and utility items were distributed in wards of AIIMS Hospital, New Delhi.



Colours of Life, CPAA's annual art exhibition and sale assumed a digital avatar and changed colours to a new monthly format in view of the ongoing pandemic. A medley of groups and solo art shows are being presented online every month this year. Proceeds from this exhibition aim to provide continued help and assistance to these patients.

'Better Survival Through Our Hands' was this year's global theme for International Childhood Cancer Day observed worldwide on 15th February. CPAA was one of the champion organizations representing India. The 'Tree of Life' created by Childhood Cancer International, had children from all over the world, participating with their own hand-prints, giving hope and encouragement to thousands like them battling cancer every day. Team CPAA celebrated this occasion at B J Wadia Hospital, Mumbai.

MARCH 2021: CPAA's Nikhar Ranawat presented a paper on 'Application of Arts Based Therapies for Children Fighting Cancer' at the 13th Childhood Cancer International's Asia Conference, Mumbai, India, virtually on 22nd March. Participants from several countries working in the Paediatrics and Childhood Cancer attended this online program. The presentation and CPAA's Giving Smiles program for Children Conquering Cancer was greatly appreciated.

Holi Celebration- Holi was celebrated with 50 childhood cancer patients at the AIIMS Hospital, New Delhi keeping in mind all the Covid-19 protocols on 29th March.



16-year old Suraj (name changed) from Alibaug (Raigad, Maharashtra) was diagnosed with Leukaemia in advanced stage and contracted Covid-19 at the same time. He was receiving treatment at Mumbai's B J Wadia Hospital. His body could not withstand this double distress and the response to treatment was very poor. His father, a village school teacher, had lost his job due to the pandemic. He initially borrowed money from the relatives and friends but when he could not raise enough money to fulfil the medical expenditure, he was on the verge of sell his home. While Suraj, awaited his Class X results, his body was unable to recover, and his condition kept getting worse day-by-day. In the meanwhile, he learnt that he had secured 90% marks in his board exams, but his condition did not allow anyone to celebrate. Even the support of a ventilator could not keep him alive, and he eventually succumbed to this double illness. As if the shock of his death was not enough, his family was presented a bill of Rs. 7.5 lakhs for his treatment. With the pandemic raging the world, all monetary resources had dried up. CPAA's team then reached out to the good offices of the Social Work Department of B J Wadia Hospital and the Wadia Trust with Suraj's family's plight. Mayuresh Rodge a Social Worker at the hospital heard us out and suggested that we appeal to the Wadia Hospital Trust with a request waive off the charges on humanitarian grounds. Fortunately, they accepted the appeal and family did not have to suffer another loss of selling their home.
